All Saints School has been unable for many years to provide cooked school lunches and Parents opted for providing pack lunches.

The Directors are aware of the School Food Standards and Framework Act 1998 and will ensure that the nutritional requirements are adhered to when supplying school lunches for pupils.

There has been much research undertaken as to the positive effects of students eating breakfast and lunch. Many of our students travel a long way into school and have very early starts. Providing breakfast and lunch is an important part of our school day. It is during this first conversations with students off the taxis that we get to find out what their mornings have been like and what additional support we may need to give.

Breakfast

Cereals, toast, crumpets and muffins and a range of jams and spreads and drinks are available all week and Friday's extend to bacon sandwiches.

Lunch

Free School meal pupils will be expected to go to the kitchen in the house before school, make their own packed lunch to increase independence skills and take their pack lunch away with them so they are just like the rest of the pupils. Facilities will be provided for them to include sandwiches using a variety of fillings, crisps, yoghurt, fresh fruit and a drink.

The provision of a temperature controlled fridge, monitored daily by staff will enable safe storage of food and the use of a microwave cooker will be available in the event of extreme weather.

College attendance

Students attending morning courses at college will be given the money to purchase lunch in the college refectory before returning to school which is the normal practice for all pupils attending college and is seen as an integral part of attending college and a positive life skill.

Curriculum

We value the importance of independent living skills and pride ourselves on the opportunities we provide to enable students to produce food and meals

Extra-Curricular opportunities

Where we provide additional experience e.g. trips, residential visits, visitors, PSHEE activities and whole school whole week themed activities free school meal students will have the opportunity to experience these and the money will support this.
