SUBJECT	ENTERPRISE
OVERVIEW	Enterprise education involves teaching students the knowledge and skills they will need to be future employees and potential employers. It includes, but is not limited to, teaching financial and organisational capability, while also providing opportunities to raise student's awareness of problems and solutions in the context of business and enterprise. Students will work together to make various items to be sold. They will learn about profit and loss and presentation. The course for the juniors and KS3 students enables them to reflect on their own enterprise skills and to relate them to their chosen career progression. Projects within this scheme of work include the study of social enterprise, personal finance, environmental enterprise and running your own business. The aim of the scheme of work is to allow students to critically evaluate their current skills and for them to develop new opportunities that will endeavour to make them more commercially aware, financially literate and to build their self-confidence.
KEY STAGE 3	Students work on producing items for sale from the kitchen and with the use of the sewing machine. They will also produce items using a variety of craft skills. In the kitchen the students will develop an understanding of basic safety, hygiene, knife skills and weighing accurately. They will learn to follow a recipe. The students will learn to thread up a sewing machine, refill a spool and explore what a sewing machine can do. They will develop their confidence and expand and build on their skills.
