#### **Pupil Premium for LAC Students**

Pupil Premium for LAC Students is applied for on a pupil by pupil basis to enhance and benefit the looked-after child's education needs as described in the personal education plan (PEP). Within All Saints School, Pupil Premium funding can be used for a multitude of additional support strategies or interventions which can include counselling and technology. During the 2019/2020 academic year, All Saints School received £1,436.40 and 2018-19 £2,220.00.

#### Year 7 Catch-up Premium

All Saints School, for the Academic Year 2018-19, received £2,666.74 as catch up premium funding which is used to fund intervention within literacy and numeracy. This intervention is targeted at students who are underachieving in these subjects and whose cognitive ability tests indicate that some extra support for literacy and/or numeracy would be beneficial.

Research shows that intervention which is delivered by teachers, working either in a small group of students or individually, has the greatest impact. Therefore, the catch up funding is used to generate time capacity for a qualified teacher to deliver this intervention work to ensure the greatest impact. Student progress is monitored and reviewed and additional sessions and support strategies are arranged if a student has not reached their target.

KS3 English and Maths classes have been divided, all classes now have additional teacher and TA to enable all student individual needs to be met.

The catch up premium funding for the 2018-19 academic year is £1,948.74.

## Coronavirus (Covid 19) Catch-up Premium Grant

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds and will be in the form of the coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium for the financial year beginning 1 April 2020.

The first instalment of the catch-up premium was paid to local authorities on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2020 and allocated to schools during Autumn Term 2020. The first payment of the catch-up premium is 25% of an initial academic year allocation.

All Saints School received £3,060 in respect of the first instalment of the grant which has enabled the school to place a teacher on Dyslexia Training (£1,950 plus VAT - £2,345). The training of this teacher will not only benefit those students who are dyslexic but will enable other students to access specific methods of learning which will help them with missed learning due to the Coronavirus pandemic. This funding, alongside Teachers' Pension Employer Contribution Grant, has also enabled All Saints School to purchase an additional 30 Chromebooks at a cost of £310.60 per device with licences (£20.64 each). The Coronavirus pandemic has shown, as a society, how reliant we are on technology and how, if used in the correct fashion, it can enhance and promote high-quality learning. The devices will function as an integrated part of a class and will enable teachers to show greater use of innovative teaching methods. They will allow for intervention work to take place ensuring quality learning activities to achieve the best possible results for our students. The chrome

books enabled us to deliver a full live timetable during lockdown. Online attendance from January to February was 91%

Any future payments of the Coronavirus (Covid-19) Catch Up Premium will be allocated at the time of receipt to best suit the needs of our students.

## <u>Teachers' Pension Employer Contribution Grant</u>

The Secretary of State for Education is providing financial assistance for schools to support the increase in employer contributions to Pension Schemes. This funding, can only be spent for the purposes of the school. All Saints School received £9,133.64 during Autumn Term 2020. Alongside the Coronavirus (Covid-19) Catch up Grant, this funding was used to purchase Chromebooks for student use within the school. An additional 30 devices (£310.60 per device) were purchased with licences (£20.64 each) as well as a charging trolley (£811.20).
