Happy New Year.

We have had a really lovely start to 2022, students were settled quickly, routines re-established and all students are working really hard on their studies. As always we have lots of things going on in school; including preparing our Year 11 and Year 10 students for exams and assessments, visits out to places to support our curriculum, professionals and visitors coming into school to support our young people with their learning.

This week we have also launched our new phonics based reading programme called Fresh Start. All staff have completed full training and we introduced it to your children in assembly on Wednesday. We have undertaken a lot of research before making any decisions and I believe this is the best way forward for all of our students regardless of their reading ability.

Reminders:

Fresh Start

At All Saints School, the whole staff are committed to encouraging all the young people in our care to learn to read, to keep reading and to experience the benefits and joys of becoming a fluent and confident reader. With this aim in sight, we have chosen to follow the Fresh Start Reading intervention phonics programme.

Beginning this January, we will deliver regular small group reading intervention to all students which will target reading fluency via phonic understanding (working out the letter sounds to build words) or comprehension (analysing what the words mean). Research shows that, as well as being enjoyable, this regular and systematic approach will mean fast progress and should help us to support everyone to develop their reading skills as fast as possible. It will take place after break for the lower school and throughout the day for the upper school and last for about half an hour.

How you can support your child:

- Use sound talk (spelling out the sounds of the different letters) to read and spell words
- Listen to your child read their Module or Anthology
- Ask your child to talk about their reading intervention and tell you about what they are learning
- Encourage and praise good reading habits and buy books for presents
