MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Firstly, an update on the pandemic. Thank you once again to everyone for their support in keeping us regularly informed of what is happening at home to enable us to make decisions at school. If your child is at home, we will be setting work and talking to you about how best we can support you whilst they are at home. We, like all schools, have experienced staffing absence, partly as a result of positive cases but also for other reasons, which means that your son or daughter may not have their regular teachers or TA's for a short period of time. I am so grateful to my wonderful staff who are adapting day in and day out and doing all they can to provide the very best support for our young people.

As I have been walking around the school and visiting the classrooms I have been delighted to see the work that all year groups are producing. This week's newsletter is a very small snapshot of some of the wonderful work that is happening in school. I am reminded of the quote by Henry Ford

"If everyone is moving forward together, then success takes care of itself" It certainly feels like this is the case in school at the moment. As always please do get in touch with us, we can't help if we don't know about it.

Toys

There has been an increase in the number of toys being brought into school which is causing upset and arguments amongst students.

Please can we ask that no toys are brought in unless they are therapeutic fidget toys, ie poppets. Bay Blades etc are not permitted.

We have also noticed an increase in swopping fidget toys which has caused some upset, we are going to tell the children that this cannot continue.

Reminders:

Absence: Please call the school office before 8.30am if your child is not coming in for any reason. If your child travels to school by taxi, you need to contact the taxi firm directly.

Covid19 Testing: If you are home (lateral flow) testing, please ensure you are doing so twice a week (e.g. Mondays and Thursdays) If you need any additional testing kits please let us know and we will be happy to provide them. If your child is unwell (and especially if showing any Coronavirus symptoms) please call us for advice—do not send them to school.

Medication: If your child requires medication during the school day, the medicine **must be** sent in its original packaging and an administration of medicine form completed and sent with it. Both must then be handed in to the office for safety reasons and in line with our school policy.

A huge 'well done' to all the year 10 and 11 students who have been working really hard over the last two weeks completing mock examinations in class, great effort from all.






Drum Kits





Work Experience for SEND students:

Information for Parents



What is work experience?

'A placement on a employer's premises in which a student carries out a particular task or duty, or a range of tasks or duties, more or less as would an employee, but with an emphasis on the learning aspects of the experience.'

Benefits of work experience

- Access to work experience (wex) helps young people develop skills needed for all jobs, such as teamwork and communication (transferable skills)
- It's a great chance to learn new skills
- It builds confidence in interacting with adults in a new/unfamiliar environment
- It provides valuable evidence to add to the student's vocational/personal profile
- Students can see how to apply what they've learnt in school to the working world, and vice versa



WEX Norfolk - 2 types of service are available to schools to purchase via our traded service

- Standard: This placement is sourced by the student, with family/school support if needed. A health & safety assessment is completed by the WEX Norfolk team.
- **Bespoke**: The WEX Norfolk team source the placement to suit the student's interests and aspirations, taking into account their individual needs. A health and safety assessment is completed. This type is most often used for students with SEND.



Placement is evaluated & follow-up work completed in school to reinforce the learning from placement




School staff liaise with the student regarding their interests and the type of placement they would like, taking into account any additional needs



School staff will meet with WEX Norfolk team (and the student, if desired) to discuss the placement



Placement begins. Schools staff often accompany the student on the placement





The WEX team source a suitable placement; when it's agreed with school they will carry out the necessary H&S assessment and confirm with the school that it can go ahead. This can take up to 6 weeks.



Placement length and duration are agreed with the employer in conjunction with the school and taking into account the student's capabilities
