1. Introduction

This plan is based on the [contingency framework for managing local outbreaks](#) of COVID-19 and the [schools operational guidance](#), provided by the Department for Education (DfE).

We will only implement some, or all, of the measures in this plan in response to recommendations provided by our local authority (LA), directors of public health (DsPH), Public Health England (PHE) health protection team or the national government.

It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances, for example:

To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school. Actions will be considered when either of the following thresholds are met:

- There are 4 positive cases among pupils or staff who are likely to have mixed closely within a 10-day period
- If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission
- As part of a package of measures responding to a 'variant of concern' (VoC)
- To prevent unsustainable pressure on the NHS

2. Seeking public health advice

When one of the thresholds above is met, we will review the testing, hygiene and ventilation measures already in place.

We will also seek public health advice from a director of public health or health protection team. The Headteacher will be responsible for seeking this advice, and will do so by telephoning the DfE helpline (0800 046 8687)

3. Shielding

We will adhere to national guidance on the reintroduction of shielding, which would apply to those on the [shielded patient list \(SPL\)](#).

We will speak to individuals required to shield about additional protective measures in school or arrangements for home working or learning.

4. Lateral Flow Covid Antigen Testing

This is currently conducted within school twice a week (Monday and Thursday mornings) for those pupils who do not test at home, as a matter of routine and in line with Government guidelines. This will remain in place until further notice.

5. Other measures

Parents, carers, pupils and staff will be informed promptly about the introduction of control measures. This will be done via email and letters sent home with students once a decision has been made.

If recommended, we will limit:

- Residential educational visits
- Open days
- Taster days

- Parents or carers coming into school
- Live performances

If recommended, we will (re)introduce 'bubbles', to reduce mixing between groups.

6. Face coverings

Pupils, staff and visitors are currently required to wear a face covering when arriving at school and moving around indoors/in communal areas of the school (unless they have a valid exemption). This will be reviewed in accordance with any change in Government guidelines.

7. Attendance restrictions

Attendance restrictions will only be recommended as a last resort. If recommended, we will implement the measures in this section.

7.1 Eligibility to remain in school

If restrictions are recommended, we will stay open for students who wish to be in school but we may move to a part time timetable in school with full on line curriculum for times at home:

7.2 Education and support for pupils at home

If students decide to stay at home, they will receive a full timetable of remote education.

We will aim to deliver remote education that meets the same quality and quantity of education that pupils would receive in school, as outlined in our remote learning policy.

The school will continue to provide vouchers for students eligible for benefits-related free school meals while they are not attending school because of COVID-19 isolation guidelines.

7.3 Safeguarding

We will review our child protection policy to make sure it reflects the local restrictions and remains effective.

We will have a trained DSL on site at all times.

When vulnerable pupils are absent, we will:

- Speak to parents/carers and, where applicable, social workers and the local authority, to work out the reason for absence
- Encourage attendance
- Make sure vulnerable pupils can access appropriate education and support while at home
- Maintain contact, and check regularly that the pupil is able to access remote education provision.
