Attendance

Hopefully you have all now received the letters we sent last week regarding attendance. I have had a couple of queries over this and therefore wanted to explain that the government has introduced new school attendance guidance for all schools (see link below to access the full document) in which it states:

The government expects: schools and local authorities to:

- promote good attendance and reduce absence, including persistent absence
- ensure every pupil has access to full-time education to which they are entitled
- act early to address patterns of absence
- parents to perform their legal duty by ensuring their children of compulsory school age who are registered at school attend regularly
- all pupils to be punctual to their lessons

All Saints School will continue to support our young people and families with achieving good attendance and where appropriate, we will put measures in place to help with this. However, if our young people and families do not engage in these supportive measures and are unable to provide medical evidence for prolonged or frequent absences, we may have to pursue legal action.

We fully appreciate the difficulties some families experience around achieving good attendance and will always seek to support rather than take punitive measures. If you are having issues with getting your child to attend school, for any reason, in the first instance please contact the school so we can help resolve any difficulties quickly and avoid behaviours becoming habitual and embedded.

Reading Rewards – Reading for Pleasure

This academic year at All Saints School, we are promoting 'Reading for Pleasure' across the whole school. Reading for Pleasure is reading what you want to read based on your own interests and preferences, it's reading without having to worry about being graded or judged and includes being read to whatever your age.

Any opportunity to read is a good one! Reading allows us to follow our passion. When we read what we like, we read more and more often. The more we read the easier it becomes and the more we enjoy it. Benefits of reading include increased literacy skills, improved results/grades and research shows it has a positive impact on mental health.



To support the 'Reading for Pleasure' initiative we are implementing a new reward system. This is a credit system working towards Bronze, Silver, Gold Awards and Certificates. Credits will be given after the student has finished reading/sharing a book and completed a small task, the amount of credits will vary on the type and length of book. At the end of each term students who have achieved the highest level of credits for each year group will be invited on a reward trip to Waterstones to help choose books for the library. In addition to this, students who have read and had their planner signed four times a week by an adult (at school or at home) will have their names placed in a 'Lotto' and the chance to be chosen at random to join a reward trip.

Lots of new books have arrived in the library since our return after the summer. These have been specifically chosen to encourage the students to use the library and support the school curriculum.


We are delighted to receive our new 2022-2023 planners.

In 2005, I went to work for a training provider to help young apprentices find work experience in engineering, which I really enjoyed.


I have been in my current role almost 5 years, and love helping young people find the right work experience which I hope may even help them on the way to finding their dream job one day!

What is work experience?

'A placement on a employer's premises in which a student carries out a particular task or duty, or a range of tasks or duties, more or less as would an employee, but with an emphasis on the learning aspects of the experience.'

Benefits of work experience

- Work experience (WEX) develops skills needed for all jobs, such as teamwork and communication (transferable skills)
- It's a chance to learn new skills
- It builds confidence in interacting with adults
- It can spark an interest in school subjects, which leads to increased motivation at school
- It provides valuable evidence to add to the student's vocational/personal profile
- Students can see how to apply what they've learnt in school to the working world, and vice versa
- 75% of SEND school students who participated in WEX in the summer term of 2022 were offered a further opportunity with their placement provider!

The WEX Norfolk Traded Service – 2 types of placements: Schools will select the type most suited to individual students

• Bespoke: The WEX Norfolk team source the placement to suit the student's interests and aspirations, taking into account their individual needs. A health and safety assessment is completed. This type is most often used for students with SEND.

Standard: This placement is sourced by the student, with school support if needed. A health & safety assessment is completed

by the WEX Norfolk team.



Placement is evaluated & follow-up work completed in school to reinforce the learning from the placement



School staff complete the WEX Profile form with the student as early as possible, to identify their interests & type of placement they would like, taking into account any additional needs identified.

Work Experience (WEX) Process for Bespoke placements



School staff will meet with WEX Norfolk team (and the student, if desired) to discuss the info on Profile form & type of placement requested.



The WEX team will source a suitable placement and carry out the necessary H&S checks and confirm with the school that it can go ahead.



Placements can be block (a week or longer, on consecutive days) or extended (one session (full or half day) per week, over a longer period of time)depending on the student's needs



School staff often accompany the student on the placement
