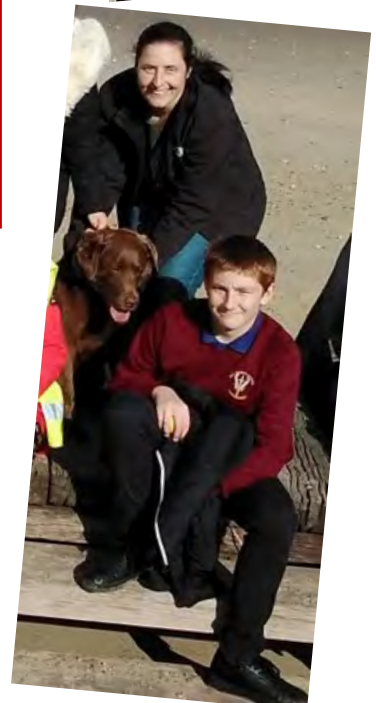

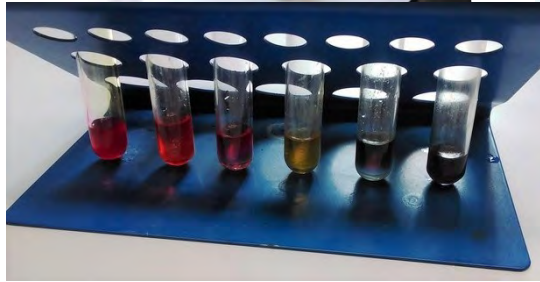
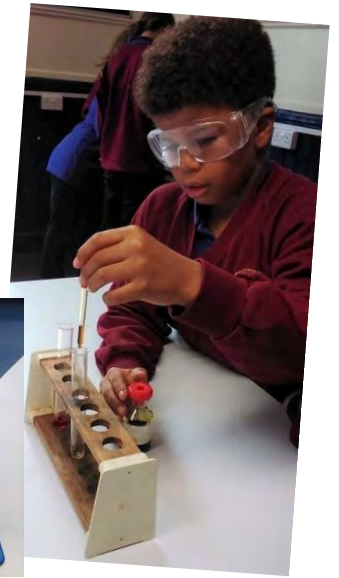
Y9 had a fabulous trip to Bacton to learn about sea defences and coastal erosion.

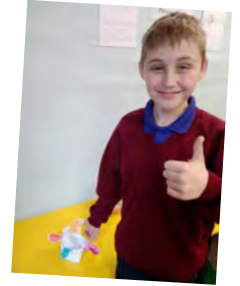
Group working with the stone age character from the museum

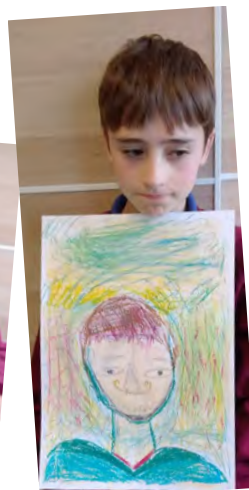
