






Art

^{*}IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR Y11 PARENTS/CARERS - GCSE exam contingency days are: Thursday 6th June (afternoon), Thursday 13th June (afternoon) and Wednesday 26th June (all day)

These contingency days have been set by JCQ and are designed to be used in the event of national or significant local disruption to examinations. If disruption occurs, the GCSE exam would be taken either for the first time or again on any date up to and including the contingency day. Students taking public examinations should not plan to go on holiday before the 26th June regardless of when their last exam takes place.

This is a JCQ decision and applies to all students taking examinations in Summer 2024 in all schools and colleges
