Dear Parents and Carers

The Year 10 team hope you had a brilliant Easter break and we are very happy to have the Year 10 students back for the Summer term!

English

This term we will practice the skills needed to write analytically and creatively in line with the GCSE English Language paper 1. This includes reading unfamiliar texts and writing descriptive or narrative pieces using the text as inspiration. Alongside this, students will plan and deliver a speaking and listening presentation to myself and if they so choose, some of their peers. This is a part of their English Language qualification and they are allowed to choose the topic themselves.

Independent learning continues this term:

For the remainder of year 10 students completing the GCSE courses in Literature are expected to carry out independent learning (or homework) when it is set on a fortnightly basis. If this becomes a problem for your child then please get in contact with myself (Mrs Jones) and I will do whatever I can to support you.

Furthermore, where students can use our new literacy programme Reading Plus at home this will have a great impact on progress, so please continue to encourage this and remember to record reading in planners so they can access the reading reward scheme!

PSHE

We are going to continue giving close attention and lots of discussion time to how we build and sustain respectful relationships in many different areas of life this half term. The work we produce on this goes toward our ASDAN qualification and we're seeing the benefits already. Alongside this we will also spend some of our PSHE lessons covering independent living skills which are so valuable to now and for the future.

Maths

In this half-term students will be primarily looking at the topics of Geometry and Algebra.

Later in the term there will be a Mock GCSE Exam which will cover topics from throughout the year. To support students' independent revision at home, homework will be set on a fortnightly basis. Students also have access to the ARC App at home which allows regular, daily revision of Maths topics (it takes around 10 minutes to complete each time you do a quiz). Developing independent revision skills for Maths has been set as a target for all Year 10 students this term.

Science

This half-term Year 10 will be finishing the Infectious Diseases topic, which looks at how diseases are spread and how our bodies protect us. Year 10 will then move on to look at Respiration and Photosynthesis with Biology and Energy Changes in chemical reactions for Chemistry.

Revision resources are available on the students google classroom page, but additional resources, questions and quizzes are available on BBC Bitesize (see link below). Students can also access revision quizzes on the website Seneca Learning and have assignments set on their class tab. Students have been shown how to access this and I would like students to be completing a minimum of 30 minutes of this per week.

Computer Science

The students following Computer Science GCSE will be completing the theory linked to computer operating systems and how they manage a system and coordinate the requirements of any added software. We will also be continuing our development of programming skills as we move from writing simple programs in scratch to using a higher level programming language and also increasing skills in debugging programs and producing pseudo code.

Art

In this half term, the Year 10s will be working towards a final piece for the 'Gathering' project and will create their final piece in a full day mock exam.
