As we reach the final term of the school year before the summer break, we wanted to get in touch to let you know our plans for learning in Year 8 in Summer 1.

English

Within this term's English lessons, students will be reading a play script called 'Chicken!'. This play is all about road/bike safety as well as peer pressure. Students will be looking at attributes of characters, the importance of informing people about road/bike safety, understanding why we use apostrophes and producing in groups their own road safety script

You can always help by reading together, either aloud or just encouraging them to make time to read at home. We will be using the school library regularly and will also have a book box that relates to our learning in the classroom. The best homework is to read regularly and this will have the greatest impact on progress, regardless of how fluently they are able to read.

History (Humanities)

The first part of the summer term sees us continue with History (up to May half term). In this time we will finish looking at The Industrial Revolution including Children at Work. This links with our next topic of the Victorian Age (1837-1901) where we look at the Poor Law and the Workhouse. Whilst studying this topic Year 8 have a trip to Gressenhall where we will be looking at the Workhouse museum to discover the first hand tales of people who worked there. We also study Queen Victoria and what life was like in the Victorian Era. Useful links:

RSHE

We will be exploring and discussing the following topics: Consent, Contraception and Parenthood, Bullying /Abuse, Social Influences; we will follow county guidance for this and ensure that the sensitive topic is taught appropriately and mindfully. If you would like to ask more questions about this, please let me know.

Philosophy and Ethics

In this term's Philosophy and Ethics lessons, students will be looking at the argument 'Science vs Religion'. Students will be able to describe the scientific account of creation as well as the Biblical account of creation.

Maths

During Summer term 1, students will be learning all about the following topics: statistics, measures and time/money or algebra

Science

In Science this half-term Year 8 will be finishing the topic Inheritance and Selection, then moving on to study the topic Properties of Earth's Materials. This Chemistry topic gives an introduction to the geological history of the Earth, but also looks at how and why we use the materials we get from the Earth.

Computer Science

In this term's Computer Science lesson, students will be looking at the topic *Layers of a Computer* System. Students will be able to explain how a computer operates and be able to explain what artificial intelligence (AI) is and how it is evolving everyday within the 21st Century.

Art

Urban and digital Art is the Year 8s theme in art lessons this half term. Developing on from last term this project looks at how cities have influenced approaches to art. Students will explore the work of Banksy through creating their own stencils and using spray paint.
