- Sun cream should be applied before school and can be reapplied during the day if students are able to do this themselves.



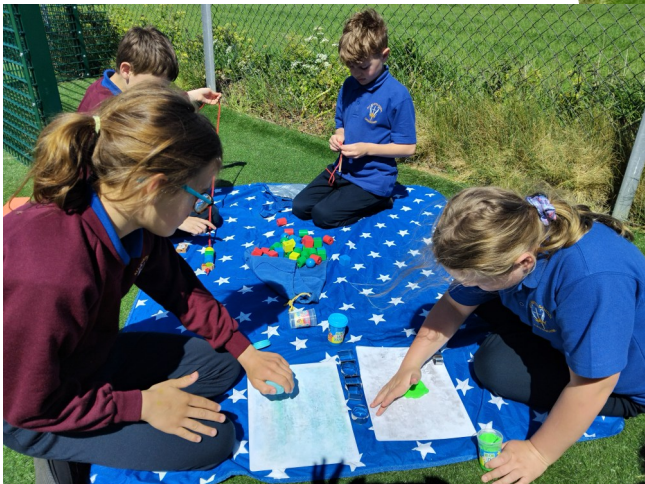
Juniors

The Upper and Lower Juniors enjoyed exploring Framlingham Castle.



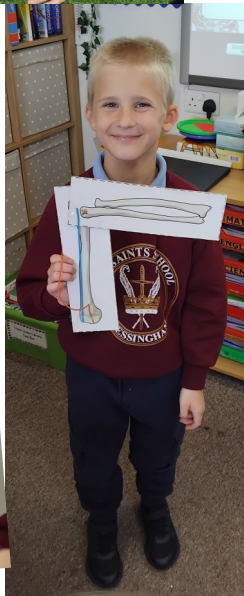
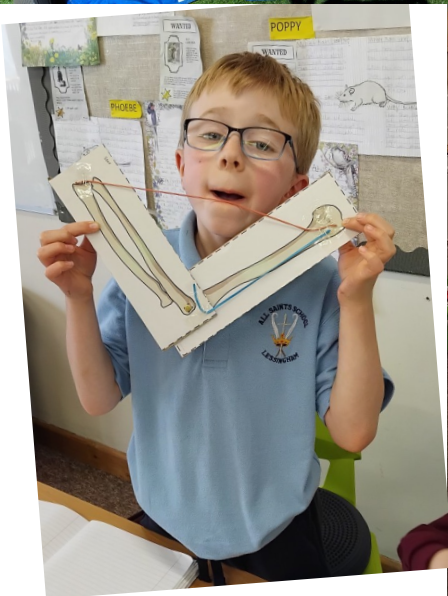
Upper Juniors

Enjoyed practising their fine motor skills in the sunshine.



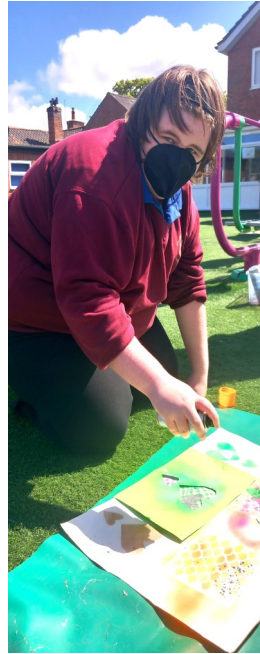
Lower Juniors

We enjoyed a fabulous History trip to Gressenhall where they learnt all about the workhouse!

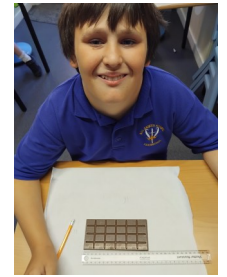


In Maths....
