MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY HEADTEACHER

Literacy is one of the things we are most passionate about at All Saints School; being able to read write and speak confidently opens up doors in all areas of the curriculum and of course is very helpful in life outside of school too! We have lots of things in place to support our students to develop their literacy skills and a big part of that is reading.

Mrs Fuller is just in the process of planning the reading reward trip for the last week of term, this will be for the students who read regularly at home and remember to share what they are reading with her and other teachers using the planner system. It is not too late to be a part of this so please remind your young people to read regularly and to track this in their planners. I often hear conversations where students are talking about what they have read to members of staff and it is lovely to hear this enthusiasm!

Up until year 9 we read aloud daily at the end of the day and as well as being a lovely cosy activity, the research all shows how valuable reading aloud is for developing vocabulary, reading and writing. If you feel able to read aloud at home as well as listening to your child read, this would be a wonderful way of helping them learn. I know many of you already enjoy sharing the books you studied at school and other stories you enjoyed as a child.

We did the Literacy Assessment Online test just before Half Term which is an annual thing and the correlation between people who read regularly for pleasure and those who engage regularly with Reading Plus and the progress made as readers was huge.



Reading at home is one of the biggest things young people can do to improves their success in school. Please keep encouraging it wherever you can: Reading Plus, Library books, own books, magazines, newspapers, fiction, non-fiction – even cereal packets are all helping to developed fluency and comprehension.

We have a really well stocked library and book boxed in all classrooms that relate to the curriculum.

If you are looking for stocking fillers, we can recommend good titles to read too!

Alumni


